## Dominique Dawes Keynote Speaker

Dominique Dawes is best known as an Olympic athlete who competed in three Olympic Games, won four Olympic medals, became the first African American gymnast to win an individual Olympic medal in women's gymnastics, and was a member of the "Magnificent 7" Gold medal winning team in the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia.

Since retiring from professional sports in 2000, she has been awarded a permanent place in the U.S. Olympic Committee Hall of Fame (MAG 7), performed on Broadway, worked for Yahoo! Sports and FoxSports.com, and served as co-chair of the President's Council on Sports, Fitness and Nutrition. She has also been a spokesperson for numerous brands and campaigns that aspired to improve the physical and overall health of women and children.

In addition to empowering others as a motivational speaker and health advocate, Dominique is a wife, mother to four children, and the founder of Dominique Dawes Gymnastics Academy.



## The Mary Harriman Community Leader Award

Mary Harriman, the founder of the Junior League, gathered a group of energized, talented, and dedicated women to address their city's social issues. Her legacy has shaped communities around the world, including Washington, DC, where the Junior League of Washington was founded over 100 years ago.

The Mary Harriman Community Leader Award recognizes a transformational female leader in the Greater Washington area who sets bold goals, opened her circle, disrupted convention, and changed the conversation for the betterment of civil society. The recipient of JLW's Mary Harriman Community Leader Award is a woman who has used her talents and resources to improve the social and economic conditions of others and whose leadership exemplifies the Junior League of Washington's mission, vision, and values.
